I have a native nursery and have been growing native trees for a number of years for the riparian and regeneration projects in our Rohe. Voluntary work includes Titi and Korure translocation on Maungaharuru, Kiwi release and caring for Ngutu Kaka enclosures on Te Heru o Teria.

I am a member of the Raupunga Water Committee who brought safe and consistent water supply to the Raupunga community. This system supplies clean potable drinking water to households that would otherwise have to rely on the weather to cater to this basic need.

On behalf of our Whanau Trust we are nearing completion of a 5-house Papakainga development and the relative infrastructure required to service the homes.

Currently working with TPK to do much needed home improvements for whanau in our Rohe, including insulation, heating, and basic repairs.

Working with a group of dedicated individuals we managed to oversee the rebuild of Te Huki. The opening in 2019 Labour Weekend was the culmination of the hard work of many people.
